While the Men's Club prefers that all bass caught be returned to the lake, if you choose to keep a bass, it must be at least 12 inches long and no more than 5 per day.

Recently, the Men's Club was privileged to receive Men's Club information in the form of typed up (on a typewriter!) meeting minutes, records and letters as well as old issues of the Normanoch News from the period of 1981-1986 from Mr. Peter Trachtenberg, who was secretary of the Men's Club years ago. Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Wow! Can you believe the Around the Lake yard sale is tomorrow? We came across an article entitled, “Hidden Treasures at Yard Sales” written by Cari Cucksey of Cash and Cari. She says that a toy from the 1970s is worth \$150.00...an old stereo, \$2000.00...and lots more. So, not only should the “buyer beware”, but also the seller.

Here are some examples: - A vintage Fisher-Price Little People Castle from the 1970s, in excellent condition, with all its accessories, could be worth \$150.00 or more. - Decades old electronics are usually inexpensive at yard sales, but amplifiers, receivers, or speakers, in reasonable condition, made by a company called Marantz, could be worth hundreds of dollars. THE LIFEGUARD STAND

Your Culver Lake lifeguards are here to protect our swimmers. Now, they would like to pass on some of their wisdom with their weekly safety tips. Even the best lifeguards can miss some things, or get tired in the sun. Our lifeguards are trained to scan the swimming and beach area repeatedly. If you see a lifeguard staring off into space or being distracted by someone, please notify a manager on duty. We won't take offence to such a notification and you never know, it might be hot and the guard may need a break. We appreciate your input.

Wear your flip flops!!! Viruses thrive in warm moist environments. So the bathroom floor is a perfect place for infections to breed. Our Canteen and Lifeguard staff will do its best to keep the floors mopped and clean, but in the meantime it is a good idea to wear flip flops while using the restroom and walking in the canteen. It will also help to prevent slipping on the wet floor.

Keep an eye on your children, especially your toddlers. Toddlers have been known to walk into the shallow beginning of the lake and keep right on walking into the deep water. They don't normally understand the danger. Yes, the lifeguards will do their best to ensure the children's safety, but ultimately we need your help. It's a team effort to have a safe beach.

DON'T FORGET THE SUN-BLOCK! The Skin Cancer Foundation recommends an SPF of at least 30, reapplied every two hours. We also have umbrellas and great trees to sit under. Have a skin safe summer.

Thunder/Lightening/Storms! If the lifeguards hear thunder or see lightening in the distance we will be closing the beach for 20 minutes to start. Unfortunately, every time we hear another thunder clap or see more lightening we have to start counting

the 20 minutes again. It seems like a nuisance, but, if lightening strikes at the far end of the lake, we will still be in danger at the beach. Please be patient with us. We can't control Mother Nature.

Swim floaties (that go around a child's arm) and lifejackets are potentially dangerous. Yes, they are allowed at the clubhouse beach. The problem with these devices is that they give the children and parents a false sense of security. A swim floatie can pop or come loose while the child is in the deep end, or a lifejacket can slide over the child's head or the strap between the legs can become tangled. The best prevention is to teach your child to swim. It is also a good idea to accompany children who use these devices while in the deep end. As always, if the lifeguard on duty is not comfortable with the floatation device that the child is wearing, he or she has a right not to allow the child into the deep end. This may be frustrating for the child and the parents, but it is all for safety sake.

Children under the age of ten (10) are not permitted at the clubhouse without adult supervision. This is important due to the potential number of swimmers in the water. The guards do their best; however, it is a joint venture between the clubhouse staff and the parents. We thank you for your cooperation.

Some of the rules that lifeguards enforce can seem a bit much, however, they are there for a reason. Our lifeguards are trained to tell the difference between play and a struggling swimmer. When the swimming area is crowded we may not be able to tolerate a lot of horseplay. We will do our best. If we ask swimmers to calm down we are doing so because we are unable to keep an eye on everyone at that particular moment. We will do our best to allow members to enjoy the fun and games of the water.
